The Importance of Nutrition in Cancer Care!

Abstract:

In this seminar we will address the importance of nutrition in cancer care. Specifically, we will review validated malnutrition screening tools and the nutrition assessment process. Additionally, we will discuss in detail the importance of the nutrition-focused physical exam and how that it is reflected in the criteria of diagnosing malnutrition in a chronic disease state. The seminar will briefly explain the altered metabolism in the cancer patient and how that is reflected in their energy and nutrient needs. We will explore common nutrition-impact symptoms and nutrition interventions to manage them, and the importance of collaborating on a multidisciplinary team to provide optimal care for the patient. Lastly, we will consider the timing of monitoring and following our patients during their cancer treatment process.
