SingHealth Duke-NUS Family Medicine Academic Clinical Programme (FM ACP) Medical Student Research Internship (MURI) Programme from December 2024

FM ACP welcome the immersion of medical students from local medical schools to participate in the Medical Student Research Internship (MURI) Programme. The interns can either

- 1. develop research projects de-novo which align to the Signature Research Programmes (SRP) and mentored by an established Family Physician researcher or
- 2. participate in current research projects anchored by researchers in FM ACP as a study team member

Current Research Projects (open to medical students)

- 1. Factors Shaping Medication Adherence: Insights and Implications, SGH
- 2. Evaluating the Implementation of a Blood Pressure Telemonitoring Service (Primary Tech-Enhanced Care Hypertension [PTEC-HT]) in a Public Primary Health Institution: A Mixed Method Study Based on the RE-AIM Framework, SHP
- 3. Bibliometric Analysis of Publications in SG To Assess the Impact of Primary Care Research on the Health of the Population

The interns have to undertake a brief interview to assess if they fulfil the requirement and to specify their period of commitment. The internship ranges from 4 to 6 weeks for direct hands-on to understand the mechanics of research in FM but the involvement may be extended beyond the approved period to complete the project and/or the related publication. The interns must seek official approval/acknowledgement from their respective medical school for their participation in MURI (except NUS YLLSOM students).

MURI is open throughout the year for interested students, who have to complete the Research Ethics and Compliance Training (CITI-Program).
