



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The postgraduate programmes welcome applications from candidates with at least a Bachelor's degree and preferably working in healthcare.

This is a requirement for all international applicants except those from English-speaking countries such as Australia, Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, and the United States. Minimum test scores for TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) paper-based test is 600, TOEFL internet-based test is 85, or for IELTS (International English Language Testing System) is 7.

The TOEFL score of IELTS result is only valid for 2 years after the test and should be valid by the end of the application deadline for the programme.

Applicants to upload a scanned copy of the official TOEFL/IELTS results via the online application form.

Shortlisted applicants may be required to undergo one or more interviews as may be prescribed by the programme directors from time to time.

Personal Statement

You will need to upload a Personal Statement as part of your online application. The statement supports your application by demonstrating that the programme is right for you and that you have the skills, knowledge, and aptitude to achieve the programme requirements. You can use the description as a guide to the points you address in your statement. You can also talk about how the programme fits in with your desired academic progression or career aspirations. You could structure your statement like this:

- Current studies/works and how they are useful or relevant
- Why you chose this programme
- Relevant work experience, skills, and interests
- Why you chose this university
- Concluding paragraph

Detailed Curriculum Vitae (CV)

Please upload your updated and detailed CV together via the online application form. You are encouraged to include your involvement or participation in patient safety & healthcare quality initiatives and works, if applicable.

Letters of Reference:

If you wish to include Letters of Reference to support your application, you may do so by uploading the letters in your application via the online application form. Please note that the programme directors may get in touch with the referees for clarifications, if required.
