In this talk, Laurence will provide an overview of Singapore's national Al programme, Al Singapore (AISG), its programmes and initiatives, and how it will contribute to the recently announced National Al Strategy 2.0.

Participants will also get to learn how AISG develops generational AI capability through its various programmes as well as accelerate the adoption of Al by the industry through examples from its flagship programmes, 100 Experiments (100E) and the Al Apprenticeship Programme (AIAP).

Achieving Seamless Transition of Care for End Users



Joyce Wong Director, CEO Office Director, Centralised Services SPD (a disability focused organisation)

The social model sees 'disability' as the result of people living with impairments interacting in environments that are filled with physical, attitudinal, communication and social barriers. It therefore carries the implication that we must change the physical, attitudinal, communication and social environments to enable people living with impairments to participate in society. However, the extent to which persons with disabilities are included in the community is also dependent on how inclusive physical infrastructure, information, institutional practices and public attitudes are. Seamless transition of care and community participation have been the key drivers of SPD's improvement initiatives.

In this presentation, Joyce will highlight some of the driving forces behind the need to change and innovate for charities like SPD, our experience of facilitating smoother transition of clients to the community and between programmes. There are always challenges in the journey of change. Joyce will share some strategies that had worked for SPD in overcoming some of the challenges.

Mindful Self-Compassion: Could this be the impetus for a **Compassionate and Resilient Healthcare System?**



Dr Carmen Teo Founder and Director Mindfulness and Compassion Programs Mindful Insights

Mindful Self-Compassion (MSC) which involves a rather radical way to comfort and motivate ourselves while in the moments of struggling including feelings of inadequacy, empathetic distress, and general life stressors, can be a valuable resource.

According to Neff (2003), self-compassion involves the three components of self-kindness, common humanity, and mindfulness. Extensive research found that self-compassion is associated with psychological wellbeing states such as increased optimism, resilience, and happiness, and reduced depression, anxiety and stress.

As human beings, we are all worthy recipients of compassion. Self-compassion also helps to grow and sustain our compassion for others. MSC is a skill that can be taught and developed with practice; and there exists program formats that support this. In this session, brief MSC practices will be facilitated.

Hacking the House Codes at the National Library Board



Gene Tan Chief Librarian and Chief Innovation Officer National Library Board, Singapore

The National Library Board (NLB) nurtures Readers for Life, Learning Communities and a Knowledgeable Nation by promoting reading, learning and history through our network of 28 libraries across Singapore, the National Library and the National Archives of Singapore.

NLB is disrupting itself yet again to transform more than two decades after the first major overhaul of its services in the 90s to become a leading library system in the world. LAB25 is NLB's blueprint to transform our libraries and archives to serve our patrons' evolving reading and learning needs. In line with our LAB25 goals, we focus our efforts on four roles: building a Learning Marketplace, nurturing an Informed Citizenry, inspiring Singapore Storytellers, and being an Equaliser.

Gene will share how, with LAB25 (Libraries and Archives 2025), NLB is embarking on a rapid prototyping process with its people and partners to experiment with new service models and break the traditional house codes of libraries and archives.

Belina has over 25 years of success in building and leading award-winning and transformative business innovation across various disciplines at Fortune's World's Most Admired Top 50 Companies in fintech (MasterCard), lifestyle services (American Express) and travel (Singapore Airlines).

Ms Lee launched many award-winning innovative offerings such as Priceless Cities and Priceless Engine during her time at MasterCard Worldwide. Prior to that, Ms Lee led various global and regional roles across customer experience, engagement & loyalty, marketing, network planning, revenue management as well as product & business development at American Express and Singapore Airlines (SIA).

Under her leadership, Mandai recently won the 2021 IDC special award for digital resiliency for Transformation 2.0, alongside industry leaders such as Changi Airport Group, Grab and DBS. This was in recognition of the whole-of-organisation approach in driving the triple bottom line of Planet, People and Performance, supported by four key change enablers of people, processes, platforms and products.





Laurence Liew

Director, Al Innovation Al Singapore

Laurence Liew is the Director for Al Innovation at Al Singapore. He is driving the adoption of Al by the Singapore ecosystem through the 100 Experiments, Al Apprenticeship Programmes and the Generational Al Talent Development initiative. A visionary and serial technopreneur, Laurence:

- was appointed the first RED HAT partner and authorised training centre in the Asia Pacific in 1999
- built A-STAR's IHPC first High-Performance Computing (HPC) cluster in 2001 (initial HPC clusters in NUS, NTU, and SMU were mostly built by Laurence and his team)
- built and operated Singapore's first Grid (pre-cloud) platform for IDA's National Grid Pilot Platform in 2003
- architected the Cloud business and technology for then Singapore Computer Systems' Alatum Cloud (now owned by Singtel/NCS) in 2007
- led Platform Computing Inc business in South Asia and R&D team in Singapore; IBM acquired Platform Computing in 2009
- led Revolution Analytics Inc business in Asia and R&D team in Singapore. Microsoft acquired Revolution Analytics in 2015
- joined Al Singapore in June 2017 as the first employee

The Singapore government has appointed Laurence to represent Singapore at the Global Partnership in AI (GPAI), an OECD initiative. He is the current Co-Chair of the Innovations and Commercialisation working group and Co-Chair of the "Broad Adoption of AI by SME" committee. Laurence graduated from the National University of Singapore (NUS) with a First Class Honours in Engineering and a Master in Knowledge Engineering.

Joyce Wong Director, CEO Office Director Centralised Services, SPD (a disability focused organisation)

Joyce joined SPD in November 2005 and is currently the Director for Centralised Services as well as the CEO Office. She plays an instrumental role in these functions, setting the direction and drive for the development of the organisation's programmes and services. Prior to her current portfolio, Joyce had also led other programmes in SPD including children services, adults and the elderly services as well as advocacy.

In the various roles that she subsequently held in the sector spanning close to 30 years, Joyce gained wide-ranging experience in areas such as direct social work, policymaking, service planning, programme management and advocacy. Her experience extends beyond disability to also include eldercare and the rehabilitation of ex-drug offenders as well.

Cynthia is a Professional Speaker (CSP), Best Selling Author, 2-Time TEDx speaker and Voice Coach. Cynthia has been a professional speaker and coach for the past 22 years and her engagement spans 5 continents in 23 countries and regions such as USA, France, Sweden, Finland, The Netherlands, Portugal, Spain, Bulgaria, Argentina, Egypt, Singapore, Malaysia, Hong Kong, Macau, mainland China, India, Brunei, Vietnam, Thailand, Indonesia and The Philippines. Cynthia has spoken to more than 20,000 audience members across industries, from the world's top MNCs as K & L Gates Washington D.C., Stanford University, Sofia University, Mercer, Google, HSBC, Procter & Gamble, to Government bodies as British High Commission Singapore, Immigration & Checkpoints Authority, Singapore Air Force etc. Cynthia has appeared in Singapore Radio Program 938 Live 4 times, Hong Kong Radio 3, and Malaysia Business Radio Station BFM as a guest expert.

She's a regular guest on podcast shows around the world, appeared on more than 20 podcasts. As a voice coach, Cynthia has helped clients from 52 countries across 6 continents with their voices to speak with impact and conviction, engages and inspires people to embrace change and take action.

Dr Lee has been developing and driving innovation programmes at the national level with a focus on health and medtech. Prior to his current role, Dr Lee was the Principal Investigator for a pre-spinoff medtech project around cerebrovascular stroke monitoring and detection. He served in a joint appointment at the Institute of Materials Research and Engineering and the Institute of High Performance Computing at A*STAR.

Dr Lee is an accomplished and certified adult educator - he has trained more than 600 researchers, healthcare professionals, and corporates in Design Thinking and the Biodesign methodology. Dr Lee holds a PhD in Bioengineering from the University of California, San Francisco – Berkeley and a BSc in Biomedical Engineering from Brown University. He completed his post-doctoral training at the Stanford School of Medicine under the Singapore-Stanford Biodesign Innovation Fellowship.

Josie is a dedicated caregiver to her daughter, who was on the Left Ventricular Assist Device (LVAD mechanical heart pump) for more than eight years before her heart transplant in 2021. To care for her daughter, Josie worked closely with the healthcare team to achieve the best outcome. She received the Singapore Health Inspirational Caregiver Award in 2014.

As Co-Chair of SPAN, she actively represents the voice of patients and caregivers through initiatives aimed at improving care quality. Some of the key projects she has been involved in include being part of the SGH's biennial management retreat – SGH Advance 2020 – where she shared perspectives and insights to help shape the envisioned concepts of tomorrow's hospital. She also co-led and presented the survey on the "Concerns of Patients and Caregivers through COVID-19" to SingHealth senior management together with Kim Soon, and has shared her caregiving story with healthcare professionals at various platforms as part of staff education, amongst many others.

Chew Kim Soon Co-Chair SingHealth Patient Advocacy Network (SPAN)

A dedicated caregiver to his late mother who suffered from multiple conditions including Parkinson Disease, Kim Soon actively shares his experience and knowledge with healthcare teams and caregivers with a keen interest in the improvement of patient safety and care quality. He has over 32 years of experience in marketing communications, relationship management and analytics within the corporate banking sector.

As Co-Chair of SPAN, he taps on his skills and expertise to bring forth the patient's voice in initiatives aimed at improving healthcare. His key contributions include the Plain English Glossary which helps healthcare workers "speak the patient's language" amidst the prevalent use of jargons, co-leading a survey on the "Concerns of Patients and Caregivers through COVID-19" to evaluate how the experience of patients and/or caregivers may have changed through the pandemic, concerns, and how options such as medication delivery and telehealth may impact the experience. Results of the survey were presented to SingHealth senior management. His passion to amplify the patient's voice is also evident in his commitment to share his perspectives with new nurses at onboarding sessions.

Dr Carmen Teo (she/her) is a senior mindfulness teacher who has a long-time meditation practice in wisdom traditions. An exscholar and corporate leader turned contemplative educator, she is forever grateful for the gift of meditation and having wise teachers appearing in her life to support her living her values.

She holds full Certifications in MBSR and MSC training, and various other curriculums with international institutions. She is also an International MBSR Teacher Supervisor (UC San Diego Centre for Mindfulness), an independent researcher and a yoga teacher.

Since 2015, she has delivered mindfulness and compassion programs to thousands of people from all walks of life including business organizations, social welfare agencies, and educational institutions.

Gene is the Chief Librarian of the National Library Board (NLB) and watches over the professional development of all librarians NLB. As Chief Innovation Officer, he is spearheading the development of LAB25 (Libraries and Archives Blueprint 2025), a new transformative vision for the National Library, National Archives and the public libraries in Singapore.

Previously, as the Executive Director of the Singapore Bicentennial Office at the Prime Minister's Office, Gene helmed the Singapore Bicentennial which commemorated the 200th anniversary of Raffles' arrival in Singapore in 1819.

The commemorated include The Bicentennial Experience at Fort Canning which broke attendance records for exhibitions. He was also the Creative Director of the SG50 capstone event, The Future of Us Exhibition that captured the hopes and dreams of Singaporeans.

Gene was formerly the Director of the National Library, where he developed the Singapore Memory Project, and also the former President of the Library Association of Singapore.
