



SINGHEALTH DUKE-NUS GLOBAL HEALTH FELLOWS PROGRAMME

SUPPORT GIVEN

- Tuition fees and miscellaneous fees, capped at \$12,350.00* per year, payable to Saw Swee Hock School of Public Health, NUS (SSHSPH) for the enrolment of Masters of Public Health (Global Health)[#] 24-month part-time programme.
- Paid leave[^] for up to a maximum of 3 months over 2 academic years.
- Eligibility to apply for top-up research grant for field research at an approved overseas site in ASEAN as part of the course requirement. Grant award is based on merit of the field research proposal that is submitted to SDGHI.

* For Singaporeans and PRs; and inclusive of miscellaneous fees.

WHO CAN APPLY?

- All SingHealth clinicians who are Associate Consultants and above.
- Singaporeans and PRs only

SELECTION CRITERIA

- Fulfil criteria for, and success in, admission to the MPH (GH) programme in SSHSPH
- Demonstrated maturity, integrity and cross-cultural awareness/sensitivity.
- Commitment to contribute to the development of global health in our region and to the building of the necessary capabilities in our AMC.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- Submission of application for the Global Health Fellows Programme through respective ACPs, with strong recommendation from the ACP Chair, and endorsements from Head of Department, Division Chair & CMB of respective sponsoring institution.
- Applicant should separately apply for admission to the MPH (GH) programme in SSHSPH, according to the standard process.

- Duly completed application form with necessary endorsements obtained and supporting documents attached, including:
 - ✓ Updated curriculum vitae
 - ✓ Two letters of recommendation from faculty (including ACP Chair)
 - ✓ Duplicate enrolment documents submitted to SSHSPH for the MPH (GH) course, including your personal statement
